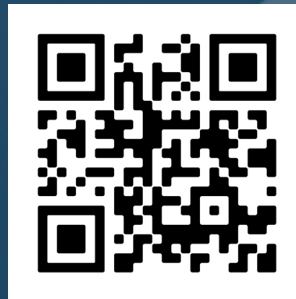

AFTERCARE REGIONAL INDEPENDENT LIVING PROGRAM

Aftercare Regional Independent Living Program provides additional support, training, and assistance services to participants 18 to 23 years old who have aged out of home care. The program is available to any qualifying resident of Kenosha, Racine, and Walworth Counties at no cost.

Aftercare is dedicated to supporting young people as they make the transition from living with their foster parents to living as independent adults in the community. Participants are paired with trained professionals who are available to guide them and assist them in the process. Aftercare participants are also encouraged to connect with each other for peer support and community.

Some of the wide variety of services available to Aftercare participants include:

- Housing search assistance and rental application assistance
- Housing program referral assistance and case management
- State and federal program and benefits referral and enrollment assistance
- Independent living skills preparation and demonstration
- Interpersonal communication skills enhancement
- Therapy and counseling referrals
- Employment search assistance
- Transportation assistance
- Postsecondary course selection and enrollment assistance and continued support
- Educational support vouchers
- Driver education and licensing assistance
- Legal aid advice and continued support
- Budgeting and money management development
- Goal development and planning support
- Community Resource Center contact information and guidance
- Weekly classes on topics of education, employment, housing guidance, health/wellness and permanent connections
